Introduction

I The Assurance of Salvation

- A. Paul affirmed that they were:
 - 1. Loved by God Rom 1:7; Col 3:12; 2 Thess 2:13
 - 2. Chosen by God Eph 1:4-6, 11; Col 3:12; 2 Thess 2:13
- B. Paul assured them because the gospel came to them:
 - 1. With words Heb 4:12; Rom 10:14-15
 - 2. With power Rom 1:16; 1 Cor 4:20
 - 3. With the Holy Spirit 1 Cor 2:4-5
 - 4. With deep conviction 2 Peter 1:1-11

II The Imitation of Paul's Faith

- A. Paul reminded them of his example Acts 20:17-21
- B. Paul encouraged them because:
 - 1. They became imitators:
 - a. Of Paul 1 Cor 4:16; 11:1; Phil 3:17; 4:9
 - b. Of the Lord Luke 9:23-24; Rom 8:29
 - 2. They welcomed the message with joy: 1 Thess 2:13
 - a. In spite of severe suffering 2 Thess 1:4
 - b. With joy given by the Holy Spirit Rom 5:1-5; James 1:2-4
 - 3. They became a model to all the believers:
 - a. In Macedonia
 - b. In Achaia Eph 5:1; 1 Cor 11:1; 1 Tim 4:12; 1 Peter 5:3; 2 Thess 3:9

III The Influence of a Transformed Life

- A. The Lord's message rang out from them:
 - 1. In Macedonia
 - 2. In Achaia
- B. Their faith in God had become known everywhere Rom 1:8
- C. Their reputation was well known because of:
 - 1. The kind of reception they gave Paul
 - 2. How they turned to God from idols

- a. To serve the living and true God Acts 3:19-20
- 3. How they were waiting for his Son: Acts 1:11; Jam 5:8
 - a. Whom God raised from the dead 1 Cor 15:3-4
 - b. Who rescues us from the coming wrath 2Thes 4:17

- 1. What has been the most significant transformation that you've noticed in your life since coming to Christ?
- 2. What impact does it have on you to know that you are loved and chosen by God? Is it hard for you to accept?
- 3. What specific evidences of a transformed life did Paul identify in the Thessalonican church? Do you see these in our fellowship? Are they evident in your life?
- 4. Paul says a lot about modeling in this passage:
 - a. What character qualities, spiritual disciplines, attitudes and actions would mark the life of a Christian leader you would be excited about imitating?
 - b. Who are you modeling your life after?
 - c. Whom are you intentionally modeling for?
- 5. What are best known for among your friends and family? Are you satisfied with that? If not, what steps will you take?
- 6. On a scale of 1-10, how would you rate your level of expectancy as it relates to the return of Christ? How does that impact your values, goals and daily activities?
- 7. Take time to reevaluate your Christian life based on the characteristics of a leader you would want to emulate. What areas in your Christian life need to change for you to be a reliable model of Christ to others?
