3. Paul identifies the goals of his prayer in verses 10-12 [Outline IIIA-D]. Of these four characteristics, which do you find most inspiring? Most challenging? What, if anything, keeps you from living this way? What steps should you take?
4. Ephesians 5:10 tells us to “find out what pleases the Lord.” On a scale of 1-10, how pleasing is your life to God? What steps will you take today to live a life more pleasing to Him?
5. Use the format of Paul’s prayer in verses 9-14 to intercede for someone in your life. Then give them a call, encourage them and let them know that you are praying for them!
6. Take time to thank God for qualifying you to share in the inheritance of the saints, for rescuing you from the dominion of darkness and for bringing you into the kingdom of Jesus Christ.
