I The Author

- A. Paul's history
 - 1. Persecutor of the church Acts 9:1-2
 - a. At Stephen's stoning Acts 7:54-8:1
 - b. Pursuer of the believers Acts 9:1-2
 - 2. Proclaimer of Christ 1 Cor 1:23; 2:2; Gal 6:14
 - a. Damascus road conversion Acts 9:1-19
- B. Paul's calling and authority
 - 1. Apostle of Christ Jesus

Apostle = "One specially commissioned by Christ"

- 2. By the will of God
 - a. Not of man's choosing Gal 1:1
 - b. But by the grace of God Eph 3:8; 1 Cor 15:9-10; Gal 1:13-16; 1 Tim 1:12-16
- C. Paul's mission
 - 1. Apostle to the Gentiles Eph 3:8; Acts 9:15
- D. Paul's condition
 - 1. Awaiting trial in Rome Eph 3:1; 4:1; 6:20
 - 2. Chained, yet FREE Eph 3:1; 4:1; 6:10

II The Recipients

- A. The saints in Ephesus
 - *Saint* = "One who has been set apart"
- B. The faithful in Christ Jesus
 - 1. They trusted in Him for salvation Eph 1:13
 - 2. They were trustworthy in the truth Rev 2:1-3, 6 a. However, they left their first love Rev 2:4-5
- C. The friendship between Paul and the Ephesians
 - 1. First, for a short stay Acts 18:19-21
 - 2. Then for over two years Acts 19:1-10
 - 3. He met with the elders at Miletus Acts 20:17-38

III The Greeting

A. The blessings of:

- 1. *Grace* = "God's divine favor in spite of demerit"
- 2. **Peace** = "To be free from war" Rom 5:8-10
- B. The source of these blessings
 - 1. God the Father
 - 2. The Lord Jesus Christ

- A. Our rich relationship with God (chapters 1-3)
 - 1. Our spiritual possessions in Christ (1:4-23)
 - a. First prayer: For enlightenment (1:15-23)
 - 2. Our spiritual position in Christ (2:1-22)

- B. Our reasonable response to God (chapters 4-6)
 - 1. Walk in unity (4:1-16)
 - 2. Walk in purity (4:17-5:17)
