Introduction

I The Recommissioning Of Man

- A. God blessed Noah and his sons Ps 144:15; Rom 4:6-8
- B. God commanded them:
 - 1. To be <mark>fruitful</mark> Jn 15:8
 - 2. To increase 2 Tim 2:2
 - 3. To fill the earth Matt 28:18-20
- C. God put a fear and dread of man in all creatures
 - 1. He gave them into Noah's hands Jer 27:5
- D. God granted man permission to eat meat Jn 6:53-54
- E. God imposed one dietary restriction
 - 1. Man must not eat meat with the blood in it Lev 17:11
 - 2. God will demand an accounting of:
 - a. Any animal that sheds man's blood Ex 21:28
 - b. Any man that sheds man's blood Lev 24:17-18
 - 1. Why? Because man is made in God's image

II The Covenant Of God

- A. God covenant's to never cut off all life with a flood
 - 1. Never again will he destroy the earth with a flood
- B. God confirms this covenant with the sign of a rainbow
 - 1. Whenever clouds appear over the earth and a rainbow appears, God will remember His covenant with man
- C. God fulfills His plan through Noah's sons Acts 17:25-27

III The S<mark>in Of N</mark>oah

- A. He planted a vineyard James 1:13-15
- B. He drank wine and became drunk Prov 20:1; 1 Cor 6:9-10
- C. He lay uncovered in his tent Eph 5:18
- D. Ham saw Noah's nakedness
 - 1. He told his brothers outside Prov 30:17
- E. Shem and Japheth covered Noah's nakedness
 - 1. They laid a garment across their shoulders 1 Pet 4:8
 - 2. They walked in backward and covered Noah Prov 17:9

3. They turned their faces from his nakedness - Matt 7:1-2

IV The Pronouncements Of Noah

- A. Noah cursed Ham Deut 27:16
 - 1. "The lowest of slaves will he be to his brothers"
- B. Noah blessed the God of Shem and Japheth
 - 1. May Canaan be the slave of Shem
 - 2. May God extend the territory of Japheth 1 Chron 4:10
 - 3. May Japheth live in the tents of Shem Psalms 1:1-3

PERSONAL APPLICATION

Take some time this week to consider the following:

- 1. Share a recent example of God's blessing in your life.
- 2. God commanded Noah to be fruitful, increase and fill the earth. Read John 15:8, 2 Tim 2:2 and Mat 28:18-20. How do these verses reflect the same objectives? Are you fulfilling these commands? If not, what is preventing you from doing so?
- 3. Why is blood so considered so precious to God? [See Lev 17:11]. How does Gen 9:4-8 impact your view of 1) the death penalty and 2) abortion?
- 4. In Genesis chapters 6-8 we find that Noah was a remarkable man of faith and obedience (Heb 11:7). But then in Gen 9:18-21, we find him drunk and naked in his tent. Take a few moments and write down at least 5 lessons or principles you can glean from theses two sides of Noah's character and life. How can you apply these truths to your life?
- 5. Contrast Ham's response to his father's folly with Shem and Japheth's response. How do you respond to others failings? How should you respond? [1 Pet 4:8; Prov 17:9; Gal 6:1-2]
- 6. Take a few moments to thank God for the atoning blood of Jesus Christ and for his many great and precious promises. Ask Him to give you a heart like Shem and Japheth, who delighted to promote love by covering over the sin of their father.
