Philippians 4:1-9

Introduction

I Paul Expressed His Love

- A. He referred to the Philippians as:
 - 1. His brothers
 - a. Those whom he loved Phil 2:12; Matt 3:17; 17:5
 - b. Those whom he longed for Phil 1:8
 - 2. His joy and crown 1 Thess 2:19-20
- B. He instructed them to stand firm in the Lord 1 Cor 15:58

II Paul Expressed His Concern

- A. He pleaded with Euodia and Syntyche:
 - 1. To agree with each other in the Lord Jn 17:22-23
- B. He requested his yokefellow:
 - 1. To help these women Matt 5:23-24; 18:15-17
- C. He commended these women as those:
 - 1. Who have contended at his side for the gospel Phil 1:27
 - 2. Whose names are in the Book of Life Rev 21:27

III Paul Expressed His Joy

- A. Rejoice in the Lord always Phil 1:18; 2:17; 3:1
 - 1. "I will say it again: Rejoice!"
- B. Let your gentleness be evident to all Eph 4:2-3
 - 1. The Lord is near James 5:8; Heb 13:5
- C. Do not be anxious about anything Matt 6:25-34
 - 1. But in everything
 - a. By prayer Phil 3:13-14; Ps 27:4
 - b. By petition Matt 7:7-8
 - c. With thanksgiving Eph 5:19-20; 1 Thess 5:16-18
 - 2. Present your requests to God and the peace of God:
 - a. Will guard your hearts Rom 5:1; 1Tim 1:2; Jn 14:27
 - b. Will guard your minds in Christ Jesus

IV Paul Expressed His Vision

- A. He wanted them to think about: 1 Thess 5:21-22
 - 1. Whatever is true Jn 17:17; 2 Tim 2:15

- 2. Whatever is noble 1 Tim 3:8, 11; Titus 2:2
- 3. Whatever is right Lk 1:6
- 4. Whatever is pure Phil 1:9-10; 2:14-15
- 5. Whatever is lovely Prov 24:3-4
- 6. Whatever is admirable 2 Cor 10:5
- 7. Whatever is excellent 2 Pt 1:5-8
- 8. Whatever is praiseworthy Ps 19:14; 2 Cor 10:5
- B. He wanted them to put into practice 1 Cor 4:16; 11:1
 - 1. Whatever they had learned
 - 2. Whatever they had received
 - 3. Whatever they had heard from Paul
 - 4. Whatever they had seen in Paul
- C. He wanted them to be confident
 - a. The God of peace will be with you Heb 13:20-21

PERSONAL APPLICATION

Take some time this week to consider the following:

- 1. What are your "Top 3 Pieces of Advice for Life"?
- 2. How does Paul's agape love and affection for his fellow believers challenge you? Is this the mark of your life?
- 3. The situation with Euodia and Syntyche reminds us that even godly believers can find themselves in conflict. What is Paul's advice? What else does the Bible say about how to overcome conflict? [Hint: Matt 5:23-24 and 18:151-7]? Are you in a "conflict" with someone? What biblical steps should you take?
- 4. What kinds of things make you anxious? Take a moment right now to pray through Philippians 4:4-7 verse by verse.
- 5. What do you think about when your mind isn't occupied? What is most challenging in light of Paul's suggested parameters?
- 6. Paul presents himself to the Philippians as a reliable model of Jesus Christ. What would need to change in your life/attitude to present yourself as a good example to others? Ask the Holy Spirit to fill you, lead you and guide you every step of the way!
