The Secret of Being Content

Philippians 4:10-23

I The Blessing of Contentment

- A. Paul rejoiced in the Philippians' concern for him
 - 1. Their concern was renewed Phil 2:25
 - 2. They had no opportunity to show it
- B. Paul assured them he was not in need:
 - 1. He had learned to be content Rom 8:28
 - a. He knew what it was to be in need 1 Cor 4:11-13
 - b. He knew what it was to have plenty Prov 30:8-9
 - 2. He had learned the secret of being content
 - a. In any and every circumstance
 - 1. Whether well fed or hungry 1Cor4:11; Heb 13:5
 - 2. Whether living in plenty or want 1 Tim 6:6-8
 - 3. He had come to a settled conviction:
 - a. "I can do all things through Christ who gives me strength" Jn 15:5; Eph 6:10

II The Blessing of Giving

- A. Paul commended them for sharing his troubles Heb 13:3
- B. Paul commended them for sharing in his ministry:
 - 1. They demonstrated this in the early days:
 - a. Of their acquaintance with the gospel
 - b. When Paul set out from Macedonia Acts 16:6-10
 - 2. They were the only church that shared with Paul:
 - a. In the matter of giving 2 Cor 8:1-7
 - b. In the matter of receiving Prov 11:25
 - 3. They helped him again and again when he was in need
- C. Paul's motivation in mentioning their generosity:
 - 1. He wasn't looking for a gift Matt 6:31-34; 2 Cor 9:6-11
 - 2. He was longing for what may credited to their account
- D. Paul informed them that he was content
 - 1. He had received full payment and even more
 - 2. He was amply supplied
 - 3. He had received their gifts through Epaphroditus
 - a. They were a fragrant offering 2 Cor 2:14-16
 - b. They were an acceptable sacrifice 1 Pt 2:4-5

- c. They were pleasing to God Rom 12:1-2
- E. Paul assured them that God would meet their needs: Lk 6:38
 - 1. According to His glorious riches in Christ Jesus 2Ki 4:1-7
- F. Paul exalted in the source of all provision
 - 1. "To our God and Father be glory forever! Rom 11:33-36

III The Blessing of Friends

- A. Paul desired to greet all the saints in Philippi Phil 1:1
- B. Paul expressed greetings from:
 - 1. The brothers who were with him
 - 2. The saints in Rome Rom 1:7; Eph 1:1
 - 3. The believers of Caesar's household Rom 1:16
- C. Paul gave them a closing benediction 2 Cor 13:14
 - 1. The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ be with your spirits

PERSONAL APPLICATION

- 1. When was the last time you experienced profound contentment?
- 2. On a scale of 1-10, how content are you generally?
- 3. Read Proverbs 30:8-9. What are the respective spiritual challenges and dangers of poverty and riches?
- 4. How does Paul's perspective on giving and receiving challenge you? Which do you find more difficult and why?
- 5. Commit to these keys to overcoming a discontented heart:
 - a. Never allow yourself to complain about anything!
 - b. Never picture yourself in any other circumstances/place!
 - c. Never compare your situation in life with someone else!
 - d. Never allow yourself to wish "this/that" had been otherwise!
 - e. Never dwell despairingly on yesterday or tomorrow!
 - f. Never forget that God is sovereign and seated on His throne!
 - g. Never fail to give thanks in all things 1 Thess 5:16-18
- 6. Contentment isn't Paul's suggestion -- it is God's command! Take a few moments to surrender this issue to God and start thanking and worshipping Him today for things "as they are!"
