I Paul's View of Himself

- A. A servant of Christ Jesus Ps 40:6-8
- B. Called to be an apostle 2 Tim 1:11
- C. Set apart for the gospel of God Gal 1:1,15; Acts 9; 13:2

II Paul's View of The Gospel

- A. The gospel was promised beforehand:
 - 1. Through the prophets Acts 10:43; Jn 5:39-40
- B. The gospel reveals the Son's identity:
 - 1. His human nature
 - a. A descendent of David Lk 1:31-33; Phil 2:6-7
 - 2. His divine nature Matt 1:20; Jn 1:1-2,14
 - a. Declared with power to be the Son of God:
 - 1. By His resurrection from the dead Acts 17:31
 - b. Declared to be "Jesus Christ our Lord."

III Paul's View of His Commission

- A. The agency of Paul's commission:
 - 1. Through Christ and for Christ
 - a. He received grace Jn 1:16
 - b. He received apostleship
- B. The goal of Paul's commission:
 - 1. To call people to the obedience: 1 Pet 1:2
 - a. That comes from faith Rom 10:17

IV Paul's View of The Believers In Rome

- A. They were called to belong to Jesus Christ 2 Thess 2:13-14
- B. They were loved by God Col 3:12-15; Deut 33:12
- C. They were called to be saints 1 Pet 1:15-16
- D. They were recipients of God's twin gifts:
 - 1. Grace Jn 1:16
 - 2. Peace Rom 5:1-2; Phil 4:6-7

- 1. How do you generally introduce yourself to new friends? What are the things you share to reveal your identity?
- 2. Read Philippians 3:4-5. How do you think Paul might have introduced himself before his conversion? What does the term "servant" reveal about Paul's post-conversion view of himself? Do you share Paul's identity as a servant of Christ Jesus? How does your life evidence a servant relationship to Jesus Christ?
- 3. One of the obvious evidences of genuine faith is obedience to God's commands [See John 14:21]. Describe in your own words the relationship between faith and obedience. Does your life reflect a proper balance between faith and obedience? If not, take a moment now to seek God's forgiveness, repent of your sin, and yield your entire life to God as His bondservant.
- 4. The believers in Rome were a despised and persecuted minority. What impact do you think it had on them to know that they were *called* and *loved* by God? What impact does it have on you to know that you are *called* and *loved* by God? Do you really believe it? Why or why not?
- 5. What's the relationship between *grace* and *peace*? Is it possible to have one without the other? Are you experiencing God's peace in your life right now? If not, take a moment right now to read and pray through Philippians 4:6-7.
