I A Righteousness From God

- A. A righteousness that is not based on the law Phil 3:9
- B. A righteousness that has been made known
 - 1. The Law testifies of it Gal 3:8-9
 - 2. The Prophets testify of it Acts 10:43; Luke 24:44
- C. A righteousness that comes through faith in Jesus Christ
 - 1. To all who believe regardless race Rom 10:12-13
 - a. For all have sinned and fall short of God's glory Eccl 7:20
 - b. For all are justified freely by His grace Eph 2:8-9
 - 1. Through the redemption of Christ 1 Pet 1:18-19

II A Righteousness Through Christ

- A. God presented Christ as:
 - 1. A sacrifice of atonement: 1 Jn 4:10; 2 Cor 5:21
 - a. Through faith in His blood Phil 3:8-9
- B. God did this to:
 - 1. Demonstrate His past justice
 - a. He left previous sins unpunished Acts 17:30-31
 - 2. To demonstrate His present justice Is 45:21
 - a. He is just in judging man's sin Deut 32:4
 - b. He is just in justifying repentant sinners Rom 4:25
 - 1. Those who have faith in Jesus Rom 10:4

III A Righteousness By Faith

- A. Faith excludes boasting. Why?
 - 1. Boasting is rational if one relies on the Law Rom 4:2
 - 2. Boasting is irrational if one relies on faith 1 Cor 1:30-31
- B. Faith excludes boasting. Why?
 - 1. We are justified by faith apart from the Law Eph 2:8-9; Gal 2:16-17
- C. Faith excludes boasting. Why?
 - 1. God is the God of both Jew and Gentile
 - a. The circumcised are justified by faith Acts 13:38-39

b. The uncircumcised are justified by faith - Act 15:9

IV A Righteousness Of Balance

- A. The Law is not nullified by faith Matt 5:17-18
- B. The Law is upheld by faith Gal 3:24

PERSONAL APPLICATION

Take some time this week to consider the following:

- 1. How hard is it for you to own up to your failures, sins, and weaknesses? Do you 1) admit them right away, 2) initially resist and then eventually confess, or 3) defend yourself to the death? Why do you think we are so obsessed with convincing ourselves and others that we are better than we are?
- 2. Read Mk 2:15-17; Lk 18:10-14; 19:10; Rom 5:6-8; 1 Tim 1:15; Titus 3:3-7. Based on these passages, what kind of person is a candidate for God's gift of righteousness through Jesus Christ?
- 3. Look up the words "justification," "redemption," and "atonement" in a dictionary. How are these words related to one another? And what do each of these terms convey in relation to the ministry of Jesus Christ on the cross?
- 4. According to this passage, what actions has God taken to offer you a righteous standing? What are the conditions laid out in 3:21-21 for receiving this gift of righteousness? Have you met these conditions?
- 5. In light of God's way of righteousness, what happens to pride and boasting? Why? If this is so, what should mark the life of an authentic believer? Does this characteristic mark your life? Why or why not?
- 6. Take a few moments to acknowledge before God your true spiritual condition. Confess and repent of any sin that you are aware of and give Him the glory He deserves for His indescribable gift of a righteous standing in Jesus Christ.
