4. According to this passage, what actions has God taken to offer you a righteous standing? What are the conditions laid out in 3:21-21 for receiving this gift of righteousness? Have you met these conditions?
5. In light of God's way of righteousness, what happens to pride and boasting? Why? If this is so, what should mark the life of an authentic believer? Does this characteristic mark your life? Why or why not?
6. Take a few moments to acknowledge before God your true spiritual condition. Confess and repent of any sin that you are aware of and give Him the glory He deserves for His indescribable gift of a righteous standing in Jesus Christ.
