Romans 11:17-36

### Introduction

### I God's Plan for the Gentiles Illustrated

- A. The fact of the Gentiles' dependence
  - 1. Some natural branches have been broken off Jer 11:16-17
  - 2. A wild olive shoot has been grafted in
    - a. It shares the root with the natural branches
    - b. It shares the nourishing sap of the root Eph 3:6
- B. The response of the Gentiles' dependence
  - 1. Humility: Do not boast over the Jews Rom 3:27
  - 2. Gratitude: Do not be arrogant 1 Pet 5:5-6
    - a. The branches were broken off for unbelief Heb 3:12
    - b. We were grafted in because of faith Rom 4:16-17
  - 3. Fear: We too could be broken off Phil 2:12-13
- C. The basis of the Gentiles' dependence
  - 1. God's character in action
    - a. His sternness to those who fell 1 Cor 10:1-5, 11-13
    - b. His kindness to those who continue Heb 3:13-15
      - 1. Otherwise you also will be cut off Matt 3:8-10
  - 2. God's restoration in action
    - a. Those who don't persist in unbelief will be grafted in

# II God's Remedy to Gentile Conceit Revealed

- A. God has allowed Israel to experience a partial hardening
  - 1. Until the full number of Gentiles has come in -Rom 11:11
  - 2. In future, "All Israel will be saved" Hos 3:4-5
- B. God will send a deliver from Zion Is 59:20
  - 1. He will turn Jacob from godlessness Acts 3:26
  - 2. He will take away their sins Heb 10:16-17
    - a. Because of the Gospel, they are "enemies" Col 1:21
    - b. But because of election, they are loved Deut 4:31
      - 1. For God's gifts are irrevocable
      - 2. For God's calling is irrevocable Ps 89:34
- C. God will show mercy to both Jew and Gentile
  - 1. Gentiles were at one time disobedience to God

- a. But have now received mercy 1 Pet 2:10
- 2. The Jews have become disobedient to God
  - a. In order that they may receive mercy 1 Tim 1:13-14
- 3. God has bound all men over to disobedience Gal 3:22
  - a. In order to have mercy on them all 1 Tim 2:2-5

### III God's Plan of Salvation Extolled

- A. God is distinguished in His intellect Col 2:1-4
- B. God is distinguished in his justice Is 40:28; Prov 25:2
- C. God is distinguished in His knowledge Is 40:13-14
- D. God is distinguished in His generosity Job 41:11
- E. God is distinguished in His sovereignty Col 1:15-19

### PERSONAL APPLICATION

Take some time this week to consider the following questions:

- 1. What is necessary to produce healthy, plump, delicious fruit? How do these principles relate to the Christian life? [Jn 15]
- 2. If you were to describe your present spiritual life in terms of a branch, would you be: 1) Broken off and dead? 2) Attached but withering? 3) Healthy looking but fruitless? 4) Healthy and consistently bearing fruit? How can you be more fruitful?
- 3. When you think of God, how do you tend to view Him? As doting and permissive? As angry and harsh? How has your view affected your relationship with Him?
- 4. Why does God want to bind all men over to disobedience (vs. 33)? Have you been convinced of your need of God's mercy? How does your life evidence a daily dependence on Him?
- 5. Which of God's traits does Paul celebrate in verses 33-36? How are verses 33-36 a fitting summary to the facts of chapts. 9-11?
- 6. Take a moment to thank God for "grafting you on" to the Root, Jesus Christ. Ask Him for a heart of humility, gratitude and fear and for an opportunity to share with someone this week the marvelous gift of life through faith in Jesus Christ.

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
