



# The Ten Commandments

**This week looked at commandment #10:**

“You shall covet your neighbor’s house...” (Exodus 20:17a NET)

**We read about the Israelites’ victory over Jericho:**

While Joshua was looking out at Jericho, he noticed a man with a drawn sword. The man asked Joshua to remove his sandals. This reminds us what other similar event?

\_\_\_\_\_ at the burning bush.

This reinforces God’s choice of Joshua as Moses’ successor as leader of His people.

Joshua was given specific instructions on how to conquer Jericho.

1. The people were to march around the city \_\_\_\_\_ time each day for \_\_\_\_\_ days.
2. The people were to march \_\_\_\_\_ times around the city on the \_\_\_\_\_ day.
3. The people were to remain \_\_\_\_\_ on the first six days.
4. They were to \_\_\_\_\_ when Joshua instructed them to do so on the 7th day.

The people did just as Joshua instructed. For seven days, they followed God’s instructions. On the seventh day, the walls of Jericho fell down and the Israelites were able to enter the city and destroy it just as God instructed.

**God had already given them the victory; Joshua and the Israelites just needed to show up for the \_\_\_\_\_.**

**God commands us to not covet.** To covet means to want something that belongs to another exceeding normal limits. **Why does God command this?** Again, just as we discussed with stealing, when we covet, not just want something but covet, we are telling God what He has given us is not enough.

**Consider what God did for Joshua...** He caused the walls of Jericho to fall down without any human effort. ***If God wants you to have something, don’t you think it is within His ability to give it to you?*** Of course it is so if He is withholding something, you have to believe it if for good reason because God loves you and knows what is best for you. Trust Him to provide for you just as He provided for Joshua and the people.

**Answers:** Moses and the burning bush; 1. one, six; 2. seven, seventh; 3. quiet; 4. shout; Joshua and the Israelites just needed to show up for the battle.
